Working Wall/Book corner	Books	
 English banner Book Cover for Literary Leaves book displayed on working wall and door of classroom. EYFS and KS1 -RWI sounds grid displayed. Simple chart in EYFS and complex chart in KS1 EYFS- Simple sound cards displayed KS1- set 2 and 3 cards displayed Books neatly displayed and accessible. Books rotated in the reading area to add interest. 	 EYFS and KS1 children to record work in phonics books when an approriate phonic stage is reached. Children to mark work in line with 'tick and fix' RWI active marking session. Many reading sessions in KS2 will not involve recording but when they do, work is to be recorded in a 'Reading Work Book'. No formal learning ladder will be required. Pupils should date work and use neat handwriting to ensure work is legible. 	
Homework Assessment		
 Pupils in EYFS and KS1 to read at home at least 3 times per week and an adult to record this in their reading diary. Sound books also to be practiced. KS2 Children to read 5 times per week and record these sessions either independently or by an adult. All diaries to be checked weekly by an adult in school and underlined in highlighter to clearly show reading achieved per week. 	 Pupils in EYFS, KS1 and those still accessing phonics in KS2, to be assessed every half term using RWI assessments and Reading Lead to re-goup accordingly. KS2 pupils to undertake the optional SATs tests for reading, once per term. Any pupils in the lowest 20% to be assessed half termly using miscue anaylsis and interventions planned accordingly. 	

Phonics	EYFS, KS1 and children in KS2 requiring phonics, to follow the RWI scheme and to adhere to the prescribed lesson sequence for teaching sounds, word reading and fluency.
Literary	Once children in yr2 no longer require phonics sessions they will move to the
