#### Friendship / Anti-Bullying week

On Thursday we rounded the week off with a whole school rotation morning. The children were mixed into new classes to take part in activities around the school. Whilst it is impossible to list all the activities we have covered, I am going to try to give you a summary below!

Kick starting our week was an **Odd Socks Day**. Children and staff embraced this, taking opportunities to share how everyone is different and everyone is special. EYFS children illustrated this perfectly in our photo above.

During the week the year groups have been busy listening to stories, sharing ideas and completing tasks linked to Anti-Bullying.





**Year 1** spent time with the coach in PE building letters using their bodies to spell the word 'friends'. They enjoyed doing this whilst working as a team.



**Year 2** Pine Class created a friendship song with Mrs Frogson whilst Birch Class wrote a recipe for a good friend.

Both classes talked about trusted adults they can talk to if they are worried about bullying.





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**Year 3** created friendship clouds saying what makes their friend a good friend to them. They completed the secret kindness challenge for another child in class.

**Year 4** created anti-bullying shields of happy thoughts and people who can help us. They created a positive mirror image with positive words added by our class friends.

**Year 5** made friendship recipes with ingredients for good friends and they designed friendship chains. Year 5 also had lots of discussions about the importance of being a good friend

**Year 6** were fantastic helpers during our rotation morning and were perfect role models, they demonstrated how to be kind and inclusive.
